Provides criteria for environmentally-preferable products

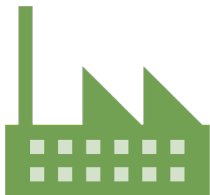


Considers the life-cycle of the product





Guide the consumers to choose products that are environmentally sound;



Encourage manufacturers to adopt processes and supply products that have less adverse environmental impact;



Use the label to empower consumers and complement the government's environmental policy

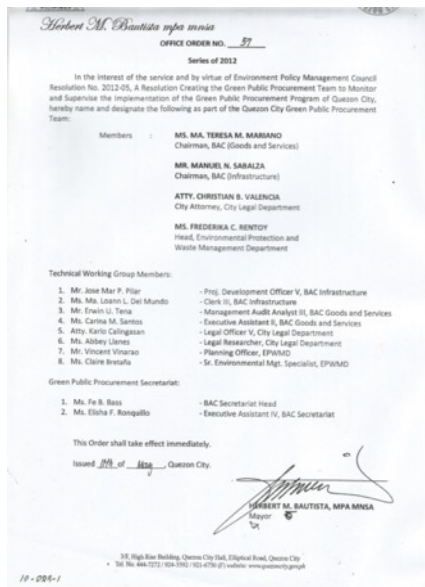

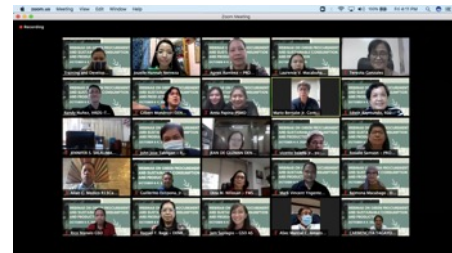
